English Literature encourages students to present informed, personal and creative responses to literary texts by considering:

- the ways in which writers use and adapt language, form and structure in texts;
- the interpretation of texts by different readers from different historical periods;
- how texts relate to one another and to literary traditions, movements and genres;
- the cultural and contextual influences on readers and audiences.



English Language

You will explore the study of English Language both as a medium of communication and as a topic in its own right, with an emphasis on the ability to pursue lines of enquiry, debate different views, and work independently to research aspects of language in use and how language functions in society.

You will explore different topics and you will use exciting and relevant text and data-based sources to inspire you in your study of English Language.

- A Level English Literature (80% written exams, 20% coursework)**
- A Level English Language (80% written exams, 20% coursework)**

Progression routes:
